


Day 1

• Smetana Hall is a famous concert hall in the Municipal House.



• The gate is 65 meters tall and is one of the symbols of Prague. Construction of the gate began in 1475 in the Gothic style.








The Church of Our Lady before Týn..

Astronomical clock.


• It is located in the Old Town Square. It was built in 1410. It is the third oldest working clock in the world..

Cherninsky Palace.

• A Baroque building in Prague. Since 1934, it has served as the seat of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in former Czechoslovakia, and it is currently the headquarters of the Czech Ministry of Foreign Affairs.















Prague Castle.

• It is the official residence of the President of the Czech Republic. In the past, it served as the seat of power for the kings of Bohemia, Roman emperors, and presidents of Czechoslovakia.

Cathedral of St. Wita.

• It is the residence of the Archbishops of Prague and the Primate of the Czech Republic. It is located on the Hradčany Castle Hill.



















Charles Bridge.

• It's a bridge connecting Lesser Town with Old Town, with a total length of 516 meters. One of the most popular and visited attractions by tourists.



John Lennon Wall.

• Since the 1980s, the wall has been filled with graffiti inspired by John Lennon and snippets of Beatles lyrics.

Moravian Karst.

• The Moravian Karst in the Czech Republic. In the 94 km² area, designated as a protected landscape area in 1956, there are over 1600 caves, of which four are accessible to visitors.
